Pakistan may buy more cotton, soybean from US

KARACHI: Pakistan is likely to buy more cotton and soybean from the United States (US) in an attempt to halve its bilateral trade surplus and escape tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump, according to a Bloomberg report on Wednesday.

WTO alarm over global trade as China products face up to 245% US tariffs

BEIJING: China on Wednesday denounced Washington's tariff escalation after the White House revealed levies on certain Chinese goods had reached as high as 245 percent, telling the US to stop its pressure tactics and intimidation.

Power generation rises 5% in March
