KARACHI: The Sindh excise and taxation department on Tuesday announced that it would launch a week-long 'road checking campaign' next week against tax defaulting vehicles across the province.

"We are launching such a campaign on Jan 9, which would continue for a whole week," said provincial minister for excise and taxation and narcotics control Mukesh Chawla after presiding over a meeting at his office.

Mr Chawla, who also holds parliamentary affairs portfolio, said the required arrangements had been made to launch the campaign.
