

Conflict of interest

THE prime minister's adviser on commerce Razak Dawood recently in a TV interview asserted that although Descon was a family-owned company, there was no conflict of interest when it got the bid for construction of Mohmand dam.

This he said arguing that he had resigned from the company's management.
