## Govt to import 100,000 tons of Russian oil every month

KARACHI: In a bid to ensure cheap energy in the country, the government will import 100,000 tons of Russian crude oil every month. The Minister of State for Petroleum, Dr Musadik Malik, while talking to reporters here on Saturday said that the government is making all-out efforts to ensure supply of cheap energy in the country.

## Base power tariff : Nepra all set to approve increase of up to Rs7.50 per unit

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) is all set to accord final approval for massive raise in electricity base rates up to Rs 7.50 per unit (27 percent) for already under financial stress domestic consumers for FY 2023-24, to be effective from July 1, 2023.

## Firm trend on cotton market

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Saturday remained firm and the trading volume remained satisfactory.
