World Bank warns of sluggish growth, high inflation

ISLAMABAD: Projecting a persisting mix of sluggish growth rate and high inflationary trends with significant downside risks, the World Bank on Tuesday advocated Pakistan for a sharp fiscal adjustment of about 4pc of GDP and decisive implementation of broad-based reforms committed to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to get out of the fiscal and macroeconomic quagmire.

LAHORE: Cotton arrivals in the country have exceeded last year's total output by nearly 29 percent, but the country's largest cotton-producing province, Punjab, has seen a sharp decline in its harvest, a data from the ginners showed on Tuesday.

Punjab on track to harvest second-highest rice crop in five years

LAHORE: Punjab province, the biggest rice producer in Pakistan, is expected to harvest 5.5 million tonnes of rice this year, the second highest in the last five years, official data showed on Tuesday.

Aliens to face expulsion after Nov 1

ISLAMABAD: All foreign nationals living illegally in the country, including millions of Afghans, have been given until November 1 to leave voluntarily or face deportation, caretaker Interior Minister Sarfraz Bugti announced on Tuesday.

Govt tightens transit trade import regime

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Tuesday banned the import of goods, prone to smuggling to Afghanistan through its territory, as it made the import regime stringent in a decisive move to stop the damage inflicted on the national economy and the external sector because of the misuse of the Afghan Transit Trade Agreement (ATTA).

Further tax on salaried class sought

ISLAMABAD: The World Bank has recommended Pakistan to start taxing monthly salaries below Rs50,000 and further reduce the Rs500,000 per month income threshold for charging the highest income tax rate of 35% from salaried individuals.

Petroleum sales fall to 44-month low

KARACHI: The demand for petroleum products in Pakistan hit a 44-month low at 1.06 million tons in September 2023, primarily due to a surge in prices in line with global uptrend.

Subsidised gas supply extended by 6 months

ISLAMABAD: The interim government on Tuesday decided to continue the supply of subsidised gas to two fertiliser plants for another six months but put off a decision on import of 200,000 tons of fertiliser, leaving a shortfall that could hit the wheat crop.
