'\$20m rice exports loss' blamed on transporters strike

KARACHI: The rice export sector was hit hard by the recently concluded nationwide strike by goods transporters. With export operations at a virtual standstill, rice shipments worth over \$20 million (approximately Rs6 billion) failed to leave the country, sparking alarm among exporters and trade bodies.
