### Over 58,000 traders registered against 3.2m target

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has so far registered over 58,000 small traders/new shopkeepers under the Tajir Dost Scheme against the target of 3.2 million. A senior FBR official told Business Recorder that the monthly tax payments from traders would start from this month (August).

### FBR shares revenue collection plan with Aurangzeb

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) Monday shared a comprehensive plan with Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb on digitisation and strategy to achieve the revenue collection target of Rs 12.970 trillion for 2024-25.

KARACHI: The Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (KATI) has urged the government to immediately release a pending Rs 33 billion electricity subsidy crucial for Karachi's industrial sector.

### Pakistan, Turkiye agree to elevate trade, investment

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Turkiye, on Monday, agreed to further elevate bilateral trade volume and to enhance investment cooperation by pursuing full and effective operationalisation of existing agreements, early conclusion of agreements under discussion and upgrade the Pakistan-Türkiye Strategic Economic Framework (SEF).

# **Cut in POL prices expected**

ISLAMABAD: A significant reduction in fuel prices is on the cards for Pakistani consumers. According to preliminary estimates, the federal government is considering slashing petrol prices by up to Rs8.36 per litre and high-speed diesel (HSD) by Rs7.70 per litre for the fortnight commencing August 16, 2024.

# Spot rate gains amid slow activity

LAHORE: The Spot Rate Committee of the Karachi Cotton Association (KCA) on Monday increased the spot rate by Rs 100 per maund and closed it at Rs 17,500 per maund. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the local cotton market remained steady and the trading volume remained low.

# FBR chief sceptical about Rs40bn tax collection target from traders

ISLAMABAD: The new chairman of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has expressed his reservations over an ambitious target of collecting Rs40 billion from traders during the current fiscal year.

### Saving rates slashed by up to 150bps

KARACHI: The government has reduced the profits on National Savings Sch-e-mes (NSS) by up to 150 basis points (bps) after reducing the interest rate by 2.5 per cent during the last two months.

### Petrol, diesel may see Rs9 decline for next fortnight

ISLAMABAD: For the second fortnight in a row, the prices of major petroleum products — petrol and high-speed diesel (HSD) — are estimated to drop by up to Rs9.20 per litre for the next fortnight of August, mainly because of the lower international prices.

### PTA to block SIMs on cancelled or expired CNICs

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Telecommuni-cation Authority (PTA) will block SIM cards that have been registered against CNICs that have been cancelled, expired or belong to deceased persons.

### Car sales plunge 36pc in July

KARACHI: Sales of cars, sports utility vehicles (SUVs), pickups and vans stood at 8,589 units in July, reflecting a 60pc year-on-year increase and a 36pc month-on-month decline.

### Petrol price may be cut by Rs8.38, diesel Rs7.70

ISLAMABAD: The price of petrol is likely to decrease by Rs8.36 per liter and diesel by Rs7.70 from August 16 for next fortnight mainly because of low consumption by big economies.

#### Pakistan, Russia in talks for LNG trade

ISLAMABAD: In a major development, Russia has communicated to Pakistan that its LNG export terminals will get ready in 2026 for gas trade with Pakistan.

### National Savings schemes profit rates revised downward

KARACHI: The Central Directorate of National Savings (CDNS) has announced a reduction in profit rates for several of its popular schemes.

# Rupee slightly drops against dollar

KARACHI: The rupee ended marginally weaker on Monday owing to an uptick in dollar demand from importers, dealers said. In the interbank market, the rupee closed at 278.64 per dollar, down from 278.5 in the previous session.
