FY24 LSM sector grows 0.92pc YoY

ISLAMABAD: The Large Scale Manufacturing (LSM) sector has shown a growth of 0.92 per cent during fiscal year (July-June) 2023-24 when compared with the same period of last year (2022-23), says Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

SBP increases clean lending limit for SMEs by 100pc

KARACHI: Amending the Prudential Regulations for SME Financing, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has announced to increase the clean lending limit for SMEs by 100 percent to ease access to finance. With a view to further facilitate SMEs access to finance State Bank increased clean lending for SMEs.

Weekly SPI inflation down 0.16pc

The Sensitive Price Index (SPI)-based inflation for the week ended August 15, 2024, decreased by 0.16 per cent due to a decrease in the prices of onions (4.91 per cent), petrol (3.15 per cent), diesel (2.44 per cent), wheat flour (1.83 per cent), moong (1.81 per cent) and sugar (0.59 per cent), according to the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

THE RUPEE PKR: some improvement

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee registered some improvement against the US dollar, appreciating 0.06% in the inter-bank market on Friday. At close, the currency settled at 278.54, a gain of Re0.16, against the greenback. On Thursday, the local unit had closed at 278.70 against the greenback, according to the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Power users may get Rs4.5bn refund in September bills

ISLAMABAD: For a change, government-owned power distribution companies (Discos) have sought a negative fuel cost adjustment (FCA) of 31 paise per unit to refund about Rs4.5 billion, overcharged to consumers in July through a 20 per cent increase in base tariff for the current fiscal year.
