Markets predict no change in monetary policy

KARACHI: Pakistan's central bank is set to make a critical announcement on Tuesday as it unveils its next monetary policy statement. The domestic financial markets have undergone a notable shift in expectations, with a consensus now leaning towards maintaining the current benchmark policy rate at a record high of 22%. This marks a departure from earlier predictions, which suggested the possibility of a modest rate cut in December 2023.
