Industrial consumers in Sindh: SSGC plans three days a week gas suspension

ISLAMABAD: The Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC) has planned two to three days industrial closure in Sindh in a week depending upon the line pack conditions and the acceptance of RLNG-local gas blend by industrial consumers.

THE RUPEE PKR: upward trend

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee maintained its upward trend against the US dollar for the fourth successive session as it appreciated 0.09% in the inter-bank market on Friday. As per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), the rupee settled at 283.26 after an increase of Re0.25.

Big industry output contracts in October

ISLAMABAD: Large-scale manufacturing (LSM) contracted in October after two months of consistent growth, data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics showed on Friday. The LSM shrank 4.08 per cent in October on a year-on-year basis. The main contributors to negative growth are textile, paper and board, iron and steel products, electrical equipment, automobiles and furniture.

Economic Coordination Committee okays roadmap to settle issues with KE

ISLAMABAD: With over Rs400 billion in government claims and Rs210bn in counterclaims from K-Electric, the Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet approved a roadmap for settling long-standing issues with Karachi-based integrated private utility, including additional power supply from the national grid, 10-year future generation commitments by KE, and financial settlements through mediation.

Sindh digitises revenue services

KARACHI: Sindh's Caretaker Industries and Commerce Minister Mohammad Younus Dagha on Friday launched the E-Services app. The digitisation and online services project was announced some weeks ago by the minister.

Fuel prices slashed by up to Rs14

ISLAMABAD: The government on Friday reduced the prices of all petroleum products by 4.6 per cent to 6.4pc (Rs10 to 14 per litre) for the next fortnight ending Dec 31 due to lower international market prices and exchange rate gains.

Short-term inflation surges past 43pc

ISLAMABAD: Annual short-term inflation surged 43.16 per cent in the week ending on Dec 14, primarily fuelled by pulses, rice and vegetables, reported the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics on Friday. The weekly inflation remained above 41pc for the fifth week in a row as gas prices, electricity tariffs stood higher than a year ago.

According to airport sources, the installation of "e-gates" has been started at Karachi's Jinnah International Airport, Lahore's Allama Iqbal Airport and Islamabad International Airport to provide fast immigration facility to passengers.

Sindh digitises land records, industrial matters with online app

KARACHI: Sindh government launched a mobile app on Friday to offer online services for land and industrial matters, a move that the provincial minister for revenue, industries, and commerce said would boost transparency and ease of doing business.

Weekly inflation stays at six-month high on food, gas prices

ISLAMABAD: Weekly inflation rate remained at a six-month high of 43.16 percent in the week ending on December 14, as soaring food prices continued to squeeze consumers, official data showed on Friday. The main drivers of the inflation were food items, especially sugar, pulses, eggs, and rice, which saw sharp increases in their prices over the year.

Govt slashes petrol price by Rs14 per litre

ISLAMABAD: The caretaker federal government on Friday decreased the prices of petroleum products by up to Rs14 per litre for the next fortnight on the recommendation of the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority. According to a notification issued by the Finance Division, petrol, which was earlier being sold at Rs281.34 per litre, will now be available at Rs267.34 per litre, showing a drop of Rs14.
