Cabinet ratifies ECC decision on gas tariffs

ISLAMABAD: The caretaker federal cabinet on Thursday approved an increase in gas prices for various sectors with an expected highest increase in gas tariff for domestic consumers.

<u>Price of diesel hiked by Rs8.37, petrol's by Rs2.73</u>

ISLAMABAD: Interim government on Thursday decide to raise the ex-depot prices of petroleum products up to Rs 8.37 per litre for fortnight starting from February 16, 2024, owing to increase global oil prices and exchange rate adjustment. The price of petrol has been increase by Rs 2.73 per litre, while rate of high speed diesel (HSD) by Rs 8.37 per litre.

<u>LSM attains negative growth in 1H</u>

ISLAMABAD: The overall Large Scale Manufacturing (LSM) sector has shown a growth of -0.39 per cent during the first half (July-December) of 2023-24 when compared with the same period of last year, says Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

Unprotected gas consumers to bear the brunt

ISLAMABAD: Protected consumers face a gradual increase in tariff slabs (Rs. 80-100/MMBtu) with a cross subsidy of Rs 108 billion, while unprotected consumers see a larger increase (Rs. 200-300/MMBtu). monthly fixed charges remain unchanged with effect from February 1, 2024.

Deregulation of non-essential drugs on the cards

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet has decided to deregulate non-essential drugs since their pricing had been warped by DRAP, both because of the pricing mechanism adopted by the Authority and rent- seeking by its employees, well informed sources told Business Recorder.

<u>Circular Debt – a tough row to hoe</u>

The circular debt continues to be a growing challenge, literally, and it's the real pain in the energy sector. The proposals of tariff rationalization and circular debt are being rejected by the IMF, and the Fund has emphasized the need for a "sustainable reform plan" that avoids the use of "supplementary grants which have placed a considerable burden on the fiscal accounts in recent years".

Most FBR representations against FTO rejected

ISLAMABAD: President Arif Alvi has rejected most of the representations filed by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) against the orders of the Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) in favour of the taxpayers including overseas Pakistanis during 2023.

SECP issues consolidated 'Companies Regulations, 2024'

ISLAMABAD: The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) Thursday issued consolidated "Companies Regulations, 2024" to facilitate local and foreign companies operating in Pakistan.

UK economy falls into recession

LONDON: Britain's economy fell into a recession in the second half of 2023, a tough backdrop ahead of this year's expected election for Prime Minister Rishi Sunak who has promised to boost growth.

EU cuts growth and inflation forecasts for 2024

BRUSSELS: The European Commission on Thursday cut both its growth and inflation forecasts for the eurozone in 2024, as it warned geopolitical tensions spelled rising uncertainty for the single-currency area's economy.

Forex reserves rise by \$52m in a week

KARACHI: The country's total liquid foreign reserves rose by \$ 52 million and stood at \$ 13.149.1 billion end of the last week, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) reported on Thursday.

Germany overtakes Japan as third-biggest economy

TOKYO: Once forecast to become the world's biggest economy, Japan slipped below Germany last year to fourth place, official data showed Thursday, although India is projected to leapfrog both later this decade.

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee recorded a marginal decline as it depreciated 0.02% against the US dollar in the inter-bank market on Thursday.

Gold prices inch up

The caretaker government on Thursday night hiked the price of petrol by Rs2.73 per litre for the next fortnight. The new price of petrol is now RsRs275.62 per litre from the previous price of Rs272.89, according to a notification from the Finance Division.

<u>Cabinet okays up to 67pc hike in gas tariff</u>

ISLAMABAD: The federal cabinet on Thursday approved a 67 per cent increase in the natural gas tariff with effect from Feb 1, apparently to meet the revenue requirement of the gas utilities targeted for the current year.

Regulator slashes RLNG prices for February

ISLAMABAD: With system losses touching a massive 14.5 per cent, the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra) on Thursday notified up to 9pc reduction in the sale price of Regasified Liquefied Natural Gas (RLNG) for SSGCL and SNGPL for the current month, effective Feb 1, owing to lower international prices.

ISLAMABAD: Large-scale manufacturing (LSM) continued to recover in December for the second consecutive month, data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics showed on Thursday.

Industrial output shrinks 0.39pc in first half of FY24

ISLAMABAD: The industrial output contracted by 0.39 percent in the first half of the fiscal year 2023-24, as key sectors such as textiles, automobiles, and iron & steel products suffered declines, official data showed on Thursday.

In a move set to fuel inflation, govt hikes gas tariffs by up to 67pc

ISLAMABAD: The caretaker government on Thursday, after the federal cabinet's approval of hike in gas prices, first sent the notification copy to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in Washington, DC, and then allowed the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (Ogra) to upload it on its official website.

Petrol up by Rs2.73, diesel by Rs8.73 per litre

ISLAMABAD: The caretaker government on Thursday announced a hike in petroleum prices. The government increased the price of petrol by Rs2.73 per litre to Rs275.62 from 272.89 per litre and high-speed diesel (HSD) by Rs8.73 per litre to Rs287.33 from Rs278.96 per litre for the next fortnight starting from today (February 16).

SSGC to suspend industrial gas

KARACHI: Sui Southern Gas Company Ltd (SSGC) said on Thursday it would suspend gas supply to industries in Sindh province for 24 hours from Feb. 18 due to low pressure in the system.

PBC warns of solvency, inflation risks, offers solutions for new govt

KARACHI: The Pakistan Business Council (PBC) on Thursday urged the country's future leadership to address the pressing economic issues facing the nation, such as securing solvency, curbing inflation and overhauling the energy sector.
