## **Domestic consumers: Hike in power rates up to Rs7.12 notified**

ISLAMABAD: Federal Government on Friday notified a hike in electricity prices up to Rs 7.12 per unit for domestic consumers from base tariff of Rs 29.78/KWh in FY24 to Rs 35.50/KWh in FY25. On July 11, 2024, National Electric Power Regulatory Authority put a rubber stamp on the increase and alteration proposed by the Power Division to meet IMF conditions.

#### FBR fails to achieve Rs9.4trn collection target

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has collected Rs9.3 trillion during the whole fiscal year 2023-24, against the original target of Rs9.4 trillion, reflecting a shortfall of Rs100 billion. The FBR has announced to have collected Rs9,306 billion in 2023-24 against the revised target of Rs9,252 billion, thereby, exceeding the yearly target by a significant margin of Rs54 billion.

### Unilever to axe 3,200 office jobs in Europe

LONDON: British consumer goods giant Unilever will cut 3,200 office jobs in Europe by late 2025 in an overhaul announced in March, a source close to the matter told AFP Friday.

### KATI urges administrations to deal with rain challenge effectively

KARACHI: President of the Korangi Association of Trade and Industry (KATI), Johar Qandhari, has called on local and district administrations to implement a coordinated strategy to handle the anticipated monsoon rains effectively.

## Indonesian CG praises products being manufactured in Karachi

KARACHI: Consul General of Indonesia Dr. June Kuncoro Hadiningrat, while highly appreciating a wide range of products being manufactured in Karachi, underscored the need to diversify Pakistan's exports to Indonesia with a view to effectively deal with the trade imbalance between the two countries.

## Weekly SPI inflation up 0.11pc

ISLAMABAD: The Sensitive Price Index (SPI)-based inflation for the week ended July 11, 2024, increased by 0.11 per cent due to an increase in the prices of chicken (16.34 per cent), powdered milk (6.07 per cent), pulse gram (3.47 per cent), lawn cloth (2.43 per cent), long cloth (1.58 per cent), milk fresh (1.37 per cent) and masoor (1.23 per cent), says Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

## **THE RUPEE PKR: some improvement**

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee registered some improvement, appreciating 0.08% against the US dollar in the inter-bank market on Friday. At close, the currency settled at 278.40, a gain of Re0.21 against the greenback.

## **Gold prices jump**

KARACHI: The local gold prices in Friday saw a big leap with the global bullion value going past \$2400 an ounce, traders said. Prices of the yellow metal surged by Rs2200 to Rs249000 per tola and Rs1886 to Rs213477 per 10 grams.

ISLAMABAD: Continuing with the rising trend, the major petroleum products — petrol and high-speed diesel (HSD) — are estimated to increase by more than Rs7.60 and Rs3.50 per litre, respectively, with effect from July 16 for the next fortnight, mainly because of higher global oil prices.

### Sharp rupee depreciation feared after new IMF deal

KARACHI: Currency experts fear that the new IMF agreement may lead to a significant depreciation of the local currency, as the global lender considers the current exchange rate as a managed exchange rate, which could prompt a downward adjustment.

### Weekly inflation remains above 23pc

Short-term inflation, measured by the Sensitive Price Indicator, remained above 23 per cent for the second week, driven primarily by high vegetable, pulse and gas prices, official data showed on Friday.

## **Increase in POL prices from 16th likely**

The prices of petrol and diesel are set to increase by Rs7.67 and Rs3.72 per litre, respectively, from the next fortnight beginning July 16. The new price of petrol may be Rs273.28 and diesel Rs281.17 per litre.

## New agency to fight cybercrimes, other criminal activities

LAHORE: The federal government has decided to set up a National Forensics and Cybercrime Agency (NFSA) to eradicate cybercrimes and other criminal activities through the use of artificial intelligence and smart digital technology.

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) on Friday informed the National Standing Committee on Finance that the taxation measures taken in the budget for 2024-25 would not be withdrawn and enforcement would be the mainstay for achieving the collection target of Rs12,970 billion.

## Pakistan could rake in Rs1.5tr as farm income tax: expert

ISLAMABAD: Under the structural benchmark proposed for the upcoming International Monetary Fund (IMF) programme, Pakistan could fetch up to Rs1,500 billion in revenues from larger landholders sitting in parliament or otherwise on an annual basis.

#### FBR to enforce retailers tax scheme in 42 cities

The FBR has decided to expand the fixed retailers scheme to 42 cities of the country with a minimum tax amount ranging from Rs100 to 10,000 per month, depending on the valuation rates of shops.

ISLAMABAD: A parliamentary panel on power has called for a review of agreements reached with Independent Power Producers (IPPs), citing the enormous burden they place on the public.
