FBR amends export facilitation scheme-2021

ISLAMABAD: The exporters would now be required to submit details of the export performance for the last 2-3 years with a summary of foreign exchange realized under the revised Export Facilitation Scheme-2021. The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has made comprehensive amendments in the Export Facilitation Scheme-2021 for the exporters.

TCP directed to immediately start purchasing cotton

LAHORE: Secretary Agriculture Punjab Iftikhar Ali Sahoo reiterated on Friday that the federal government has issued directives to the Trading Corporation of Pakistan (TCP) to immediately start purchasing cotton to ensure a price of Rs 8500 per maund to the growers.

Economic stability: SBA to anchor govt's instant efforts: IMF

ISLAMABAD: Resolving Pakistan's structural challenges will likely require continued reforms over the medium-term to underpin the needed economic transformations, strengthen inclusive growth prospects and create an environment conducive to renewed private capital inflows. This was stated by IMF Director Communication Julie Kozack during a press briefing.

Base power tariff hiked by Rs4.96

ISLAMABAD: The federal government on Friday increased base tariff of electricity by Rs 4.96 per unit from July 1, 2023, across the country as per understanding with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) taking base tariff up to Rs 29.78 per unit, premised on revenue requirement of Rs 3.281 trillion, based on different yearly economic assumptions.

FCA for May: Rs1.45/unit positive adjustment in KE tariff approved

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) has approved the positive adjustment of Rs1.45 per unit in the tariff of K-Electric for May 2023 under the monthly fuel price adjustment (FCA) mechanism. The authority conducted a public hearing on July 5, 2023, on KE's FCA adjustment request of Rs1.49 per unit for May.

Load-shedding: KE says 71pc of Karachi exempt

KARACHI: Following a periodic assessment of the network, 71% of the megacity remains exempt from load shed under the schedule published by K-Electric, effective immediately.

SPI inflation up 0.33pc WoW

ISLAMABAD: The Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI)-based inflation for the week ended July 13, 2023, increased by 0.33 percent due to an increase in the prices of food items including sugar (5.22 per cent), wheat flour (4.23 per cent), gur (3.68 per cent), salt powdered (2.17 per cent) and eggs (1.34 per cent), says the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS).

<u>THE RUPEE: PKR declines</u>

KARACHI: After three consecutive gains, the Pakistani rupee registered losses against the US dollar, depreciating 0.41% on Friday. At close, the currency settled at 277.59, a decrease of Rs1.13, as per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Pakistan as an export hub

Planning Minister Ahsan Iqbal's claim that the government was striving to turn Pakistan into an export hub might take a while to come true, given that exports dropped 12 percent in the first 10 months of FY23, yet a lot of good work can be done in the short term to enable this long-term vision.

UNITED NATIONS: The Covid-19 pandemic, the cost-of-living crisis and the war in Ukraine have pushed 165 million people into poverty since 2020, the United Nations said Thursday, calling for a pause in debt repayments for developing countries.

<u>Another Rs5 hike in base power tariff</u>

ISLAMABAD: The power regulator has raised the national average tariff by around Rs5 per unit to ensure Rs3.28 trillion in funds to the loss-making power distribution companies (Discos) during the current fiscal year. The Rs4.96 hike, set to come into force from July 1 after formal notification by the government, would provide Rs477bn in additional revenue to Discos.

Expensive power to hit production, fuel inflation, warn business leaders

KARACHI: The business community on Friday slammed a massive Rs4.95 per unit increase in 'uniform national tariff' saying it will not only push up the cost of doing business but dent local production and render Pakistani goods uncompetitive on the world markets.

Pakistan undecided on lone pricey bid for LNG

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's another bid to test the international spot market for additional Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) supplies in peak winter appeared to be a non-starter when only a lone bidder turned up with offers at a significant premium making the price unviable for local consumers.

Bailout package to provide immediate stability: IMF

WASHINGTON: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has said that Pakistan's new \$3 billion loan programme would anchor the country's immediate efforts to stabilise the economy and fulfil the current balance of payments needs.

Dollar rises as IMF euphoria fades

KARACHI: It seems that the euphoria over the International Monetary Fund (IMF) Stand-By Arrangement of \$3 billion fizzled out as the dollar appreciated despite a significant improvement in inflows. The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) reported the closing price of the dollar on Friday at Rs277.59 in the interbank, showing an appreciation of Rs1.13 from the previous day's closing.

Weekly inflation stays above 28pc

ISLAMABAD: The short-term inflation, based on the Sensitive Price Index (SPI), posted a year-on-year increase of 28.96 per cent for the week ending on July 13, showed the official data released on Friday. The inflation stayed above 28pc for the past two weeks, but it decelerated a bit in the past eight weeks because the petroleum price went down a little.

'Missing' customs officers held by FIA in mega smuggling probe

KARACHI: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) claimed to have arrested two officials of the Pakistan customs, who had gone missing a week ago, at Karachi airport for their alleged involvement in corruption and smuggling.

ISLAMABAD: On the demand of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) has announced a significant raise in electricity base tariff for the current fiscal year 2023-24, allowing Rs4.96 per unit increase.

IMF loan helps Pakistan unlock another \$5.6bn in funding

KARACHI: Pakistan is set to draw in \$5.6 billion in additional financing after securing a loan from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), a move seen as helping the South Asian nation avoid a default and boosting its foreign-exchange reserves.

Pakistan receives \$6.4 billion in foreign remittances through RDA

KARACHI: Pakistan received \$6.4 billion in foreign currency inflows from its citizens living abroad through Roshan Digital Account (RDA) between September 2020 and June 2023, the central bank's data showed on Friday.

Rupee gains may lower petrol price, but IMF hurdle remains

KARACHI: Rupee appreciation would help slash the ex-depot price of petrol for the next fortnight, but the IMF condition seeking a raise in the petroleum levy could deprive consumers of this benefit, The News learnt on Friday.

Rupee falls

KARACHI: The rupee gave up previous session's gains against the dollar in both currency markets on Friday amid an increase demand for the greenback from importers, dealers said. The local currency fell by 1.13 rupees or 0.41 percent against the dollar in the interbank market.

Gold rises Rs6,500/tola

Wheat flour, food prices lift weekly inflation to 0.33 percent

KARACHI: Weekly inflation rose 0.33 percent in the week ended July 13, driven by higher food prices, especially wheat flour, official data showed on Friday. The sensitive price indicator (SPI) based inflation increased to 28.96 percent year-on-year.
