### PM wants exports to hit \$60bn in 3 years

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Tuesday chaired a meeting of the National Export Development Board wherein he tasked the authorities concerned to take the country's annual exports to \$60 billion within three years.

### With help of withholding tax data: Govt to go after 5m tax dodgers

ISLAMABAD: With the possibility of securing assent from the IMF's Executive Board on Pakistan's bailout package of \$7 billion by the end of next month, the Shehbaz Sharif government is making plans to unveil a roadmap for bringing a potential 5 million tax dodgers into the tax net.

### Upcoming budget: Donald Lu says US govt has sought \$101m for Pakistan

WASHINGTON: The Biden administration has recommended \$101 million for Pakistan to help it strengthen democracy and fight terrorism. State Department's Assistant Secretary, Donald Lu, appeared before the House Foreign Affairs committee on Tuesday to explain the 2025 budget request for South and Central Asian countries.

### Gas sector circular debt has hit Rs2.897tr, Senate panel told

ISLAMABAD: The Senate Committee on Petroleum was informed on Tuesday that the circular debt in the gas sector has increased by Rs1,700 billion in ten years and now it has reached Rs2,897

billion. The Senate body on petroleum held its meeting under Chairman Senator Umar Farooq at the Parliament House on Tuesday.

### <u>Cement dealers say govt inaction could lead to collapse</u>

LAHORE: The All-Pakistan Cement Distributors Association (APCDA) expressed frustration on Tuesday, claiming the government has ignored its strike call issued last Saturday, adding that 11 days had passed with no response from the government.

### <u>Chinese firms not to renegotiate PPAs</u>

KARACHI: The Sindh government has extended the summer holidays by an additional 14 days, with public and private educational institutions across the province, including Karachi, now scheduled to reopen on August 15.

### Mills seek govt nod for sugar export

ISLAMABAD: Sugar producers have approached the government for seeking permission for export of another 850,000 metric tons of sugar in two phases, inviting criticism as prices are already high in the domestic market.

### PBC questions govt 'ambitious' export plans

KARACHI: The Pakistan Business Council (PBC) has expressed surprise over the government's ambitious plan to boost exports by 113% to \$65 billion within three years. The PBC raised concerns that exporters were not consulted and questioned the measures taken to achieve this target.

### **Govt policies slammed as ineffective**

### US, China and UAE top export destinations

ISLAMABAD: The United States remained the top export destination for Pakistani products during financial year 2023-24, followed by China and the United Arab Emirates (UAE). Total exports to the US reached \$5.43 billion during July-June 2023-24 against exports of \$5.93 billion in 2022-23,
