THE RUPEE PKR: marginal improvement

KARACHI: The rupee saw marginal improvement against the US dollar, appreciating 2 paisa in the interbank market on Thursday. At close, the local unit settled at 278.77, up by 0.007% compared to Wednesday's close of 278.79 against the greenback, as per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Gold moves up slightly

KARACHI: Gold prices on Thursday inched up on the local market but stood its ground, traders said. The yellow metal was traded for Rs228550 per tola and Rs195945 per 10 grams, slightly up by Rs250 and Rs215, respectively.

Thin business activity on cotton market

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Thursday remained easy and the trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the rate of cotton in Sindh and in Punjab is in between Rs 19,000 to Rs 21,500 per maund.

Punjab plans early cotton sowing on 1m acres

LAHORE: Though the Federal Committee on Agriculture is yet to meet to fix targets for various Kharif crops for the provinces, the Punjab agriculture authorities have in principle decided to bring at least one million acres under early cotton cultivation.

FPCCI calls for core inflation focus, questions policy rate efficacy

KARACHI: The Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI) called on the State Bank of Pakistan on Thursday to prioritise core inflation over general inflation, questioning the efficacy of policy rate hikes as a means to curb inflation.

Govt sets timelines for energy projects, including Iran-Pipeline oversight

KARACHI: The government has outlined strict timelines for its Petroleum and Power Divisions to expedite various energy projects, including the immediate formation of an inter-provincial committee to oversee the Iran-Pakistan Pipeline Project, according to an official document.

SECP tightens corporate disclosure norms, eases rights issue process

ISLAMABAD: The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) has announced a series of amendments to the Companies (Further Issue of Shares) Regulations, 2020, aimed at improving the process for issuing rights and enhancing market transparency.

KARACHI: The foreign exchange reserves held by the central bank saw a modest increase of \$17 million to \$7.913 billion in the week ending March 8, according to the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).
