KARACHI: Bank advances sharply declined by Rs1.589 trillion during the January to April period of the current fiscal year, despite a notable reduction in interest rates, while bank investments in government securities have surged significantly over the same period.

Food import bill nears \$7bn in July-April

Pakistan's food import bill surged to nearly \$7 billion during the first 10 months of the current fiscal year, rising from \$6.82bn in the same period last year. The increase was primarily driven by higher imports of edible oil, tea and sugar to meet domestic demand.

IMF presses Pakistan to ease used vehicle imports, impose carbon tax

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has imposed new structural benchmarks for trade liberalisation in the upcoming budget, including the removal of all quantitative restrictions on the commercial import of used motor vehicles less than five years old, and the introduction of a carbon levy of Rs5 per litre.
