Monthly Economic Update and Outlook of EAW: Credit to private sector declines 39.7pc YoY

ISLAMABAD: The Finance Ministry has stated that expenditures remained under significant pressure due to rising mark-up payments which no doubt has accounted for the decline in credit to the private sector by 39.7 per cent.

Inflation to hover around 13.5pc - 14.5pc in May: report

Inflation in Pakistan is expected to hover between 13.5% and 14.5% in May and to ease further to 12.5% to 13.5% by June, the finance ministry said on Wednesday in a monthly economic update.

Gas tariff respite: Unrealistic assumptions

In a welcome change, natural gas prices are expected to decline from July 1, 2024. This is not something you hear often. But such was the magnitude of the previous two revisions, that the revenue requirement of the two state-owned gas distribution companies has been determined lower than the existing rates.

KARACHI: The unyielding heatwave spell battered mainly the southern parts of the country on Wednesday, as the Met Office warned about the prolonging intense weather.

Gold gains Rs2400 per tola

KARACHI: Gold prices on Wednesday saw a big stride on the local market with silver gaining momentum, traders said. The precious metal gained Rs2400 and Rs2058 to reach Rs242700 per tola and Rs208076 per 10 grams, respectively.

THE RUPEE PKR: marginal decline

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee reported a marginal decline against the US dollar, depreciating 0.04% in the inter-bank market on Wednesday. At close, the local unit settled at 278.40, a fall of Re0.10 against the greenback, as per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Low volume of business on cotton market

LAHORE: The local cotton market on Wednesday remained bearish and the trading volume remained low. Cotton Analyst Naseem Usman told Business Recorder that the new cotton season has started. Approximately three ginning factories have started their operations.

Govt slashes yields on T-bills by up to 60bps

KARACHI: The government borrowed more than the target on Wednes-day and reduced rates by up to 60 basis points at the auction of treasury bills.

APCC to finalise development outlay for next fiscal year tomorrow

7,167 people file returns to get SIMs unblocked

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) claimed on Wednesday that as many as 7,167 individuals had filed their returns for the tax year 2023 after their mobile SIMs were blocked, as part of a drive to enforce a law that allows the stoppage of cellular services to individuals who fail to comply with the country's tax laws.

Mercury surges to 41.5°C in Karachi as heatwave continues

KARACHI: Residents of Karachi braved the hottest day of the current season on Wednesday when the temperature increased to 41.5 degree Celsius. The Met Office warned that the harsh weather conditions would prevail in the metropolis for the next three days.

KMC ready to review pact with KE on collection of utility charges via electricity bills, mayor tells SHC
