7% policy rate cut projected for CY24

KARACHI: Pakistan's central bank is expected to cut its benchmark policy rate – cost of lending to commercial banks – by seven percentage points during the next calendar year to 15%, which will revive the lifeline of affordable financing for industries that heavily rely on bank borrowing.
