## EU decides to extend GSP

ISLAMABAD: The European Parliament has decided to extend existing GSP (Generalized System of Preferences) for another four years, ie, till 2027. However, European Council is expected to give its final approval for the extension of the current scheme soon.

#### **Ejaz over-exaggerated GCC-Pakistan FTA?**

ISLAMABAD: The caretaker Minister for Commerce and Industries, Gohar Ejaz is said to have "over exaggerated" Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) as neither FTA has yet been signed nor finalised at any forum, well-informed sources in Board of Investment (BoI) told Business Recorder.

#### PIA tops sell-off list, WB told

ISLAMABAD: The Privatisation Commission Thursday discussed the caretaker government's strategic agenda for privatisation, with specific attention to privatising Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) and other SOEs for optimising the performance of the distribution companies (DISCOs).

#### Nepra to charge Rs1.71 per unit FCA for August

ISLAMABAD: National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has notified positive adjustment of Rs1.71 per unit in tariffs of power Distribution Companies (Discos) for August 2023 under month Fuel Charges Adjustment (FCA) mechanism.

# Section 138 of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001: FBR to withdraw tax recovery notices

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has decided to withdraw tax recovery notices issued under Section 138 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001, on the basis of orders passed by Appellate Tribunal Inland Revenue, Islamabad that no coercive measures until cases have passed the test of appeal at the level of Commissioner (Appeals).

## FBR notification on adjudication powers

ISLAMABAD: The FBR has empowered Collector, Collectorate of Customs (Adjudication), Karachi-I to adjudicate cases falling within the jurisdiction of Collectorate of Customs Enforcement (Ports), Custom House, Karachi. In this regard, the FBR has issued an SRO 1398(I)/2023 here on Thursday.

## **Bank deposits perfectly safe: SBP**

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Wednesday said bank deposits of customers are perfectly safe owing to a sound banking system in Pakistan.

#### Forex reserves fall by \$131m

KARACHI: The country's total liquid foreign exchange reserves declined by \$131m to stand at \$13.031 billion at the end of last week. During the week ended Sept 28, 2023, the SBP's reserves decreased by \$21 million to \$7.615 billion down from \$7.636 billion.

## Govt debt stocks hit historic high of Rs64trn by Aug-end

KARACHI: The federal government's total debt (domestic and external) stocks continued upward journey, reaching historic mark of Rs 64 trillion by the end of August 2023, mainly due to exchange rate volatility.

#### THE RUPEE PKR: upward trajectory

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee maintained its upward trajectory against the US dollar, gaining 0.37% in the inter-bank market on Thursday. This is the rupee's 21st successive increase against the greenback. As per the SBP, the rupee settled at 283.62 after an increase of Rs1.06 in the interbank market.

## Falling trend continues on cotton market

LAHORE: The Spot Rate Committee of the Karachi Cotton Association (KCA) on Thursday decreased the spot rate by Rs 2,00 per maund and closed it at Rs 17,500 per maund. The local cotton market on remained bearish and the trading volume remained satisfactory.

# <u>Karachi Gateway Terminal operations: 25-year deal signed with Abu Dhabi Ports Group, Senate panel told</u>

ISLAMABAD: A parliamentary panel was informed on Thursday that Karachi Port Trust (KPT) has entered into a 25-year concession agreement with Abu Dhabi Ports Group (ADPG) of the UAE government to operate the Karachi Gateway Terminal Ltd (KGTL).

KARACHI: Ambassador of Denmark Jakob Linulf, while referring to economic crises in Denmark in 70s and 80s when it was also on the verge of bankruptcy, said that Denmark came out of these economic crises by coming with a concept of transforming oil and coal-based economy to a renewable energy and green economy,

#### LHC orders fine of Rs3,000 for washing vehicles at home

LAHORE: The Lahore High Court (LHC) on Thursday hearing petitions relating to environmental issues ordered a fine of Rs3,000 against washing of vehicles at homes.

#### Textile WPI: a return of competitiveness?

## **GSP+ status extended for four years**

ISLAMABAD: The European Parliament on Thursday unani-mously voted to extend the current generalised system of preferences (GSP) for another four years until 2027 for developing countries, including Pak-istan, to enjoy duty-free or minimum duty on exports to the European market.

ISLAMABAD: The dynamics of total public debt have witnessed an alarming development as the ratio of foreign debt has shot up from 36.9 per cent in FY22 to 38.3 per cent in FY23.

#### Discos to charge additional Rs1.7/unit for October

ISLAMABAD: The National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Nepra) has authorized the staterun distribution companies (DISCOs) to levy an extra Rs1.7141 per unit on power consumers through their utility bills for October 2023.

#### **Govt decides to lease out Discos for 30 years**
