Govt debt hits all-time high of Rs70.36trn by Aug-end

KARACHI: The federal government's total debt stocks crossed Rs 70 trillion mark at the end of August 2024 primarily due to massive borrowing to finance the fiscal deficit. The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Tuesday reported that the central government's total debt (domestic and external) surged by 2.1 percent during the first two months (July-Aug) of this fiscal year (FY25).
