Traders strike against hike in fuel and power prices

KARACHI: Business centers on Saturday were closed on Jamaat-e-Islami's strike call against the inflation, as the JI Central Chief, Sirajul Haq warned the interim government of more strikes if petrol and power prices were not reduced.

Markets shut across Lahore

LAHORE: Traders of Lahore on Saturday closed their shops as a protest against rising inflation and skyrocketing electricity bills and fuel prices. The strike call was given by Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) and different traders associations and was supported by lawyers and transporters.

'Shutter-down' strike observed across KP

PESHAWAR: Likewise other parts of the country, traders' community in different parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Saturday observed a complete shutter-down strike against inflation and excessive electricity bills.

PSW's e-lab management system to integrate all govt labs

ISLAMABAD: The electronic lab management system of the Pakistan Single Window (PSW) will integrate all government laboratories performing various types of tests on import/exports goods for electronic processing and issuance of test reports.

Effective today: No Raast services for 2 days due to system upgradation: SBP

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has announced that Raast services will remain unavailable for two days due to a pre-planned major system upgradation. Raast services will not be available from 09:00 AM on 3rd September, till 12:00 AM on 4th September 2023, the SBP said.

LAHORE: The Lahore Chamber of Commerce and Industry has urged the government to control the dollar flight besides bridging the gap between inter-bank and open market dollar rate.

UBG says concerned at smuggling of goods 'via Pakistan-Iran border'

KARACHI: President United Business Group (UBG) Zubair Tufail has expressed his serious concern over the large-scale smuggling of goods from Pakistan-Iran borders and said that these smuggled Iranian goods harming the local industry and if the smuggling from Iran is not stopped, many industries will be closed and the government will face a huge loss in terms of revenue.

Concern voiced over smuggling of goods

President UBG, said that in the past petrol and diesel used to come but now products like steel, chemicals, washing powder, tiles which are manufactured in Pakistan and they are paying 18% sales tax plus income tax are being easily smuggled from Iran without any duty and taxes.

Rupee set for calm week after plunging to record low against dollar

KARACHI: The rupee is expected to trade in a tight range against the dollar next week, as traders and analysts said the currency's sharp depreciation has moderated after hitting record lows. The rupee closed at 305.47 per dollar on Friday, after losing 1.15 percent in the last five sessions.

POL sales decline by 7pc in July-August FY24

KARACHI: The sale of petroleum products dropped by seven percent in the first two months of the current fiscal year compared to the same months last fiscal, as consumption of furnace oil declined in the country.

Tax bar slams FBR's updated tax filing software, seeks deadline extension

KARACHI: The Karachi Tax Bar Association (KTBA), a body of tax professionals and consultants, has expressed its dissatisfaction with the Federal Board of Revenue's (FBR) new IRIS 2.0 software, calling it "full of hiccups and difficult to cope with."

Nationwide protests: Rallies staged, shops shuttered against rising inflation, high power bills
