Refund cannot be blocked for pendency of tax reference: IHC

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) has rejected an order passed by the Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) and ruled that refund cannot be blocked due to pendency of any tax reference before the high court.

Weekly Cotton Review: Prices drop amid low trading volumes

KARACHI: Overall decline in cotton prices, with spot rates dropping by Rs 700 per pound. Trading volume remain relatively low. Heavy rains have severely damaged cotton crops in Sindh and Punjab provinces, sparking fears of a 20% decrease in overall cotton production. Industry stakeholders demand a 4-5% reduction in interest rates.
