PD proposes Rs75bn fuel relief scheme

ISLAMABAD: The Petroleum Division has proposed a Rs75 billion Fuel Relief Scheme for three months to provide targeted relief of Rs100 per litre to around 11.8 million users of two-wheelers, three-wheelers and cars up to 800cc amid a sharp increase in petroleum prices triggered by the Gulf crisis.

PM launches relief scheme for bikes, 800cc vehicles

ISLAMABAD: The federal government, Sunday, announced to have launched the Special Relief Scheme on behalf of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif in a bid to give relief to the users of small public transport and vehicles up to 800 cubic centimetres in the wake of unprecedented rise in fuel prices.

FBR 'defies' President's ADRC's ruling

ISLAMABAD: Despite a categorical ruling by President Asif Ali Zardari directing implementation of an Alternate Dispute Resolution Committee's (ADRC) decision in favour of an Islamabad based taxpayer, the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has yet to act, a silence like an open defiance of Presidential authority and a warning sign for the future of ADR in Pakistan's tax regime.

The GSP+ dividend: exports and employment

Back in 2014, when Pakistan was granted GSP+ status, a World Bank report projected that the EU's GSP+ regime could increase Pakistan's value-added textile exports under Chapters 61, 62, and 63 by US\$280 million annually and create 25,000 jobs per year (Sánchez-Triana et al., 2014).

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee continued its marginal gain against the US dollar for another week, appreciating 0.03 percent in the inter-bank market. The local unit closed at 277.32 against the greenback, a gain of Re0.09 from 277.41 it had closed at a week earlier.
