Industrial output contracted by 1.09 percent in July from a year earlier, official data showed on Monday, as the country's large-scale manufacturing sector continued to suffer from high costs and import restrictions.

KARACHI: Rupee rose to its highest level in one month on Monday as the country's real effective exchange rate index fell to the lowest since July, signaling an improvement in export competitiveness.
