ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Business Council (PBC) has called upon the commerce ministry to devise a comprehensive package aimed at streamlining crucial factors such as electricity, gas, and labour to bolster the overall competitiveness of local industries.

SSGCL raises Rs5.5bn extra

KARACHI: Sui South-ern Gas Company Ltd on Tuesday claimed to have generated Rs5.5 billion extra revenue besides saving 1,366 million standard cubic feet per day (mmscfd) of gas through industrial gas surveillance activities.

OGDCL discovers gas

KARACHI: Oil and Gas Development Company Ltd (OGDC) told investors on Tuesday it has discovered gas in an exploratory well in Rahim Yar Khan district of Punjab. The company said the discovery is in the Mari East Block where it operates with a 100 per cent mandate.

<u>Oil tanker operators end strike</u>

KARACHI: The Oil Tanker Contractors Assoc-iation (OTCA) has called off the strike after the Ministry of Petroleum invited the association for talks to resolve various issues on Wednesday.

Makers resume mobile phone assembly

ISLAMABAD: As imports are allowed, the mobile phone manufacturing units have resumed their production, currently satisfying up to 90 per cent of the country's demand for phone sets.

Circular debt hits Rs2.31tr

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's power sector circular debt for the fiscal year 2022-23 has reached Rs2.31 trillion. This marks an increase of Rs57 billion compared to the previous fiscal year, when it stood at Rs2.253 trillion, despite the government's efforts to adhere to the IMF's directives, which included raising power tariffs and addressing sector inefficiencies.

Discos seek Nepra nod for Rs1.829/unit hike

ISLAMABAD: The ex-Wapda distribution companies (XWDiscos) have sought the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority's (Nepra) green light for collection of Rs1.829/unit additional charges from consumers in October.

Pakistan pursues Russian oil imports at G7 price cap, wants better crudes

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan is seeking a monthly supply of crude oil from Russia at a price not exceeding the \$60 per barrel limit set by the Group of Seven (G7) nations, a senior official of the Energy Ministry told The News on Tuesday.

IMF finds fault with Pakistan's uplift framework

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has ranked Pakistan's development framework lowest on the basis of five major flaws out of a total of 15 categories evaluated by the Public Investment Management Assessment (PIMA).

IMF raises concerns over petrol smuggling, seeks report from finance ministry

ISLAMABAD: Expressing its concerns over unbridled petrol smuggling in the country, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) has written to the Ministry of Finance and Federal Bureau of Revenue (FBR) seeking answers on the matter.

SSGC earns additional Rs5.5bn through crackdown on gas pilferage

KARACHI: In a crackdown on gas pilferage and theft, Sui-Southern Gas Company's security services and counter gas theft operations department caught 16 factories running on suction devices, imposed a fine of Rs674 million and saved a volume of over half a billion cubic feet.

OGDCL discovers gas in Punjab

KARACHI: OGDCL, Pakistan's largest hydrocarbon exploration firm, said on Tuesday it had discovered gas at an exploratory well in Punjab province. The well, which was drilled using OGDCL's in-house expertise, reached a depth of 1,851 meters and yielded gas from two formations, the company said.

Govt warns against use of Indian IT, AI products

ISLAMABAD: Indian products are being used in Pakistani IT industry, fintech and banking sector, it was revealed on Tuesday. It is feared India may interfere in the Pakistani IT sector through its products. According to sources, the federal government has sent a letter to all the ministries, divisions and provincial governments stating some companies of IT sector,

550 FIRs registered as KE intensifies action against power theft

K-Electric (KE) has registered 550 FIRs at police stations across the city against power theft estimated at 8.2 million units of electricity, amounting to Rs418 million. The top 20 cases alone account for 3.2 million units of the total theft.

Devastating floods: Pakistan gets mere \$1.48bn out of \$10.9bn pledged in Geneva

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has so far received approximately \$1.48 billion in the form of project and commodity financing from multilateral and bilateral creditors out of total Geneva pledges of \$10.9 billion for reconstruction in the flood-hit areas.
