Hike in prices of essential drugs approved by ECC

ISLAMABAD: A meeting of the Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet has approved an increase in the maximum retail price of essential drugs/ biological and fixed wheat procurement targets of five million metric tonnes for the provinces of Sindh, Punjab, and Balochistan for 2022-23 crops with required Cash Credit Limit (CCL).

ECC allows medicine prices to be hiked by up to 20pc

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the federal cabinet Friday approved a 20 per cent increase in the prices of essential drugs for a second time in less than three months, making them out of the reach of poor amid soaring inflation.

Sindh govt sets minimum wages for labourers in three categories

KARACHI: The Sindh government on Friday formally issued a notification setting the minimum monthly wages for workers in three categories working in 42 different industries of the province. The notification was put into motion with retrospective effect from January 1, 2023.

\$58bn China-Pakistan rail link should move ahead: study

BEIJING: Beijing's proposal to develop a \$58-billion railway system that would link Pakistan with western China should proceed because of its strategic significance, a government-commissioned feasibility study has found, reported the South China Morning Post on Thursday.

FBR likely to face shortfall of over Rs100bn in April tax collection

The FBR has been facing a major blow as the tax machinery is expecting a shortfall of over Rs100 billion in achieving its monthly envisaged tax collection target of Rs586 billion for April 2023.

Weekly inflation up 46.82pc YoY, 0.15pc WoW

KARACHI: Weekly inflation rose by 46.82 percent year-on-year and 0.15 percent week-on-week during the seven-day period ending on April 27, exacerbating the financial strain on lower and middle income groups, official data showed on Friday.

Honda Cars, Indus Motor issue temporary shutdown notice

Annual inflation reaches record-high of 46.82%

Inflation slightly increased by 0.15 percent on a weekly basis while it reached a record-high of 46.82 percent on an annual basis. In the recent week, 21 essential commodities became expensive and seven became cheaper in the country, while the prices of 23 remained stable.

Tax shortfall widens to Rs400b
