KARACHI: High yields and tax-exempted profits could attract foreign investment to Pakistan, bankers and financial experts said, though it can only happen once the country manages to secure a \$1 billion loan from the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

LAHORE: The power regulator has refused to accept the industry's demand to end fixed charges for the maximum demand indicator (MDI), a system for measuring the maximum amount of electrical energy required by a specific consumer during a given period.

Interest rate to be hiked by 200bps on IMF demand

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has assured the International Monetary Fund (IMF) it will raise its policy rate by two percentage points (or 200 basis points) in order to meet the conditions set by the lender to revive the loan programme.

KIBOR hits all-time high as SBP seen getting more aggressive on rate hike

KARACHI: Karachi interbank offered rate (KIBOR), an average interest rate at which banks lend money to other banks, hit a record high, as the money market anticipated a bigger interest rate hike by the central bank.

Rupee likely to extend gains against dollar

KARACHI: The rupee is expected to strengthen further against the dollar in the coming week on an increase in the foreign exchange reserves as a result of Pakistan receiving \$700 million from China, traders said. The local currency rose around 2 rupees or 0.72 percent to 259.99 against the dollar in the interbank market during the outgoing week.

NEPRA refuses to remove fixed electricity charges for industries

LAHORE: National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) chairman Tauseef H. Farooqi has refused to lift maximum demand indicator (MDI) fixed charges, insisting the industrialists had to pay fixed electricity charges as they were assured quantum of power allocation.

KE to add 1,182MWrenewable energy by 2030

KARACHI: K-Electric (KE) plans to add 1,182 megawatts (MW) of renewable energy in its system under its Rs484 billion investment plan by 2030, a statement said on Saturday. In its investment plan, the power utility said it would add 2,172MW by 2030 and major share would be contributed through the renewable energy sources.

Dar okays four housing projects for overseas Pakistanis

ISLAMABAD: Minister for Finance Ishaq Dar on Saturday granted his nod to four housing projects for overseas Pakistanis. The projects include Nilore Residencia, Nilore Heights (3,876 apartments),

Punjab raises wheat support price to Rs3,900/40kg

LAHORE: Punjab government on Saturday increased the minimum wheat procurement price to the highest level of Rs3,900/40kg from last year's price of Rs2,200/40kg bringing it up to the market level.

Govt offers tax relief to foreign investors

Govt agrees to increase interest rate by 200bps

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has accepted another pre-condition of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for the release of \$1.1 billion critical funding – a part of \$6.5 billion bailout package – as the government agreed to increase the policy (interest) rate which stands at 17% by two per cent or 200 basis point.

Malls, markets to close at 8:30pm

KARACHI: Commissioner Karachi Muhammad Iqbal Memon on Saturday issued a new order that all markets should be shut down at 8:30pm and wedding halls should close by 10pm.

Business community disagrees to closing timings

KARACHI: The business community has rejected the orders of Karachi commissioner to close bazaars, shopping malls and wedding halls early at night in line with the energy saving plan of the federal government.
