ISLAMABAD: The Prime Minister has directed the Power Division to hire an international consultant to probe the causes of the fire incident in 747MW combined cycle Guddu power plant and determine the estimated losses, fix responsibility for negligence and suggest the way forward for avoidance of such incidents in future,

#### ECC decides to shift fertilizer, Agritech plants to gas

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet has decided to shift fertilizer and Agritech plants to indigenous gas as they wanted a revision of variable contribution margin (VCM) of Rs186/bag and capping GST.

### Broadening tax base: FBR negligence tantamount to misrule: FTO

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Tax Ombudsman (FTO) has declared that the negligence and inefficiency on the part of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) in the discharge of duties and responsibilities for broadening the tax base is tantamount to maladministration.

### SBP to introduce new products under RDA initiative

KARACHI: The SBP has decided to further enhance the scope of RDA by introducing a complaint management system "Sunwai", insurance products, pension plans and Roshan Business Account in the near future.

### PBF urges govt to fix dollar rate for six months

The Pakistan Businesses Forum (PBF) urged the government to fix the dollar rate for six months and the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) should offer to swap the dollar funds into rupees cheaply for the borrowing banks.

# Army chief reaches out to US on 'matter of economic security'

WASHINGTON: The head of Pakistan's military has reached out to Washington to request help in securing an early disbursement of funds from the IMF, media reports and officials said on Friday.
