### Heatwave-like weather expected today

KARACHI: Another spell of heatwave like weather is set to scorch the central and upper Sindh from Friday (today) with a maximum daytime temperature above 45 Celsius, the Met Office said on Thursday.

### Jul-Apr foreign borrowings down 37.7pc to \$8.123bn YoY

ISLAMABAD: The government has borrowed \$8.123 billion from multiple financing sources including \$900 million from foreign commercial banks during the first 10 months (July-April) of 2022-23 compared to \$13.033 billion borrowed during the same period of last fiscal year, showing a decline of around 37.7 percent.

## Forex reserves slump \$72m

KARACHI: The State Bank of Pakistan's foreign exchange reserves further decreased by \$72 million to \$4.312 billion at the end of last week due to external debt repayment. The total liquid foreign exchange reserves held by the country stood at \$9.938 billion as of May 12, 2023 compared to \$9.99 billion on May 5, 2023, depicting a decline of \$53 million.

## **THE RUPEE: PKR declines**

The Pakistani rupee sustained losses for the second consecutive session against the US dollar, depreciating 0.08% in the inter-bank market on Thursday. At close, the currency settled at 285.62, a loss of Re0.22 as per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

## **Gold gains, silver falls**

KARACHI: Gold prices on Thursday gained a little value but silver posted a fall on the local market, traders said. Gold prices grew by Rs500 to Rs233600 per tola and Rs428 to Rs200274 per 10 grams. Silver was available for Rs2900 per tola,

## State Bank reserves decline by \$72m

KARACHI: The external debt repayments further slashed the foreign exchange reserves of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) by \$72 million to \$4.31 billion during the week ending on May 12, announced the central bank on Thursday.

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's exports to the Middle East shrank 14.18 per cent year-on-year to \$1.912 billion in the first 10 months of FY23, mainly driven by a substantial decline in exports to the United Arab Emirates.

KARACHI: A direct containerised shipping service linking Pakistan and Russia is scheduled to commence operations later this month, opening up enhanced trade access for Pakistani products in the lucrative Russian market, an official said on Thursday.

ISLAMABAD: The Saudi Ambassador in Pakistan, Nawaf bin Al-Malki on Thursday said that the Saudi officials have arrived in Islamabad to execute 'Road to Makkah' project from May 21 (Sunday) when the first Haj flight will depart for Madina.

### Minimum asset tax on resident citizens proposed

ISLAMABAD: The Resource and Revenue Mobilisation Commission (RRMC) has proposed slapping of Minimum Asset Tax (MAT) on the value of moveable and immoveable assets owned by resident individuals in Pakistan having exceeding value of Rs100 million.

### **<u>SBP bolsters security measures to combat digital banking frauds</u>**

KARACHI: The central bank on Thursday directed banks to improve digital fraud protection controls and processes by taking timely corrective and control measures, and warned that banks would be held liable for any loss of customer funds due to delays.
