PKR declines

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee remained at the receiving end against the US dollar for the third successive session, depreciating 0.07% in the inter-bank market on Friday. At close, the currency settled at 285.82, a loss of Re0.20 as per the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP).

Pakistan, Russia sign deal to boost economic cooperation

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Russia have signed a bilateral trade agreement aimed at facilitating and reducing costs of trade between the two countries. The deal was signed during a three-day economic conference for Muslim countries that concluded on Friday in Kazan, Russia.

Activists say IMF causing climate catastrophe
